#### **PUBLIC WORKS IMPROVEMENTS**



The Stormwater Improvement project that started last year is on track to come to a close later this summer. The project includes drainage improvements in West Chatfield and in the area of Bench Street, between 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Streets. While the Bench Street improvements were completed last year, the West Chatfield improvements will be completed this summer.

Approximately \$300,000 of improvements were made to the south water reservoir last year, which included work on the interior and exterior of the tank. This year, the electrical portion of the project will be completed by installing generators at the wells/

booster station. The generators will make the drinking water system more dependable and resilient.

The 2023 Street Improvement Project is slated to being around July 10<sup>th</sup>, depending on the weather and availability of materials. The project will replace antiquated water and sewer pipes in the Grand, Hawley and Prospect Street area, will add stormwater management capabilities and will improve streets in the area. The reconstruction project will cost approximately \$1,759,000.

### CITY BOND RATING—AA STABLE

In preparation for the sale of bonds to fund the 2023 Street Improvement Project, an analysis of the City's fiscal capability was conducted by Standard & Poors Global Ratings (S&P) and the result was a re-affirmation of an AA rating with a Stable outlook. This positions the City to sell bonds at very competitive interest rates compared with others which have a lower rating. S&P cited the City's strong management, sound budgeting practices and high general fund reserves as their primary rationale for this favorable rating.

## CITY ADMINISTRATOR SEARCH

The City's search for its next city administrator attracted 18 initial applications, which has since been narrowed down to four finalists. <u>Joshua Johnsen</u> has been employed by the City of Rochester the past four years, after working at Olmsted County for 9+ years. He is currently the Strategic Initiatives Director at the City of Rochester. <u>Nick Koverman</u> currently serves as the Community Development Director at the SE MN Multi-County HRA. Prior, he served as the City Administrator in St. Charles for 15 years. <u>Michele Peterson</u> has been serving as the City Administrator/Clerk at the City of Lanesboro for the past 8 years, where she has been employed for 12 years. She also serves the City of Whalen. <u>Stephen Sarvimost recently</u> served as the City Manager at Winona for 5 years. Prior to that time, he served as city administrator at Rushford, Victoria and Watertown over a 14 year period. Interviews will be conducted on July 12th, to determine who will replace Joel Young, who will retire from that position in mid-July.
