# OG-WALKING ETIQUETTE

Following a few ground rules will help keep pets & people safe;



WIDE

1. Use a Leash. While your dog may have excellent recall, there's no telling what might trigger them to bolt or involve them in a contentious situation with another dog or a person. Even though the city ordinance language includes at heel by command or leash, having your dog off leash is risky and may make others uncomfortable.

- 2. Be Respectful. This goes for people and property alike. Don't let your dog run up to or jump on other people; keep them close to you so others can pass you without the fear of falling. Also, keep them off neighborhood lawns. Landscaping is expensive and time-consuming, and dog pee is a lawn killer.
- 3. Pick Up Your Dog's Poop. It is unlawful to permit a dog (or cat) to defecate on any private property without consent or on any public property unless immediately removed and placed in a proper receptacle.
