
SIGN UP FOR CODE RED! NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The City of Chatfield and Olmsted County Emergency Management Offices are excited to announce our new Emergency Notification System. Code Red (for both Fillmore County & Olmsted County Chatfield residents).

There are two types of CodeRed alerts:

URGENT ALERTS: Local alerts such as snow plowing, water breaks, street sweeping and street closings which may require some action on your part.

EMERGENCY ALERTS-These are life threatening emergency notifications issued through the Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS). The alert will tell you what is happening, specific instructions to follow and the anticipated emergency time frame and who is sending the alert. You may already be receiving IPAWS alerts such as AMBER alerts and Severe Weather alerts if government alerts are activated on your mobile phone. Although there is no need to signup for CodeRed for this service, doing so will ensure you receive timely and accurate alerts.

Preventing Frozen Service Lines—Check Water Temp



The city will monitor water temperature at specific locations within the system, when the temperature reaches 38 degrees, the city will notify the public to monitor their water temperatures coming into the homes and businesses. If you are concerned about your pipes freezing, monitor the water temperature in your home or business.

To properly test your water temperature in your home or business, go to the faucet closest to where the water service comes into the building (usually in the basement). Set an indoor / outdoor thermometer (not a food thermometer) inside a cup under the faucet and run the water continuously into a cup for approximately 10 minutes. After running the water on the thermometer in the cup for 10 minutes check the reading.

If the water temperature is 38 degrees Fahrenheit or lower, it is recommended to run water with a stream diameter of a pencil lead. Generally, a stream the diameter of a pencil lead is sufficient to avoid freezing but, the farther your water temperature falls below 38 degrees, the stronger the stream

Once the water temperature reaches 38 degrees or below, it is likely this may not be a short-term situation as it will take multiple days, possibly weeks, before the frost levels decrease and the risk of freezing has passed. If you are requested by the city to run water, your utility bill will be adjusted. Should you decide to run water, please notify City Hall so that your account can be marked as such. The City does not thaw out frozen service lines.

City residents and businesses may notice a slight change on utility bills in February, as new water rates go into effect. Water rates will be increased in 2024 but there is no increase on the sanitary


