School's Open.... Safe Driving, Curfews & Security...



Once school starts, people need to be more diligent than ever, when traveling around town.

Be aware of increased foot, bike and vehicle traffic. Before and after school as well as lunch time promise to be busy as kids are walking and biking to and from school and buses transport other children.



Chief of Police, Shane Fox, would like to remind everyone of the local curfew ordinance, as it will be enforced....

16 & under, curfew is 10:00 p.m. Sunday—Thursday and 11:00 p.m. Friday & Saturday.

17 curfew is 11:00 p.m. Sunday—Thursday and 12:00 p.m. on Friday & Saturday.

The exceptions from this curfew are for youth in the company of a parent/guardian and for those traveling directly home from work or a school function. *There is NO exception to the curfew ordinance during Homecoming Week* and the curfew will be enforced throughout the entire year, including Homecoming

Personal Security: Lock the doors on your home, keep the garage doors closed and lock your vehicles, even when they are parked in your driveway. Chief Fox reports that a number of vehicles have been broken into and personal items stolen.

While these incidents are not occurring at a rate that is any higher than in other years, these are disturbing reports. Fortunately, most of these incidents can be prevented simply by keeping your vehicles, homes & garages locked up. Secure your personal belongings and promptly report unusual activity by calling 9-1-1.
