Please carry a bag or two with you on your walk so you are prepared. The City has received a number of complaints about this and people need to be more considerate. Even in the parks—if your dog "does its business" while on a run in

the park, make sure that you clean up there, too.

It is important to pick up after your pet. Not only is it inconsiderate but it is unlawful to allow your pet to defecate on other private or public property without cleaning up.
