As residents of Chatfield know, the City's utility bill includes fees for basic garbage & recycling services, water usage and sanitary sewer usage. Along those lines, this article is one of those good news—bad news stories. The bad news is that sanitary sewer fees are going up, effective with the billing included in this mailing. The good news, though, is that water and garbage rates are not increasing.

To be very plain about it, the basic sewer bill will increase by \$3.60 / month and the cost of every 1000 gallons of use beyond the basic service will increase by \$.76. In other words, those folks who use less than 2000 gallons of sewer each month will have a monthly sewer bill of \$27.63 and a family who uses 5000 gallons would have a bill of \$45.15. This is the first increase in about 18 months.

The reason for the increase is to meet the increased cost of the debt caused by constructing a new wastewater treatment plant. The need to pay off a debt of \$6.5 million simply

causes rates to increase. Knowing that the project would force rates higher, the City Council had the choice of dramatically increasing rates at one time, or to increase rates gradually over time. Ultimately, the Council decided to use a series of smaller, but more frequent, rate increases, hoping that it would be easier to fit those increases into personal budgets.

Even though the rate increase is unavoidable, the City still regrets the need to do so and would appreciate your understanding.

THE CHATFIELD ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY THE REVOLVING LOAN FUND

One of the long-standing programs of the Chatfield Economic Development Authority (EDA) is the local revolving loan fund (RLF). This form of business assistance continues to be available as a financing tool to facilitate business expansion, relocation or start-ups. The purpose is to create additional jobs in the community, further diversify the economic base of Chatfield and to provide for community growth.

The Chatfield RLF is administered by the EDA and the original funds came from the US Housing and Urban Development Department through the State of Minnesota as a grant application to assist a local manufacturing company. As the original loan was repaid, a portion of the funds remained in the community to create the current RLF. The community has enjoyed success in utilizing these funds to assist local businesses.
