Rabies Clinic Wed June 14, 2006

Rabies vaccinations will be available for a fee of \$13.00 per vaccine from 8:00 a.m.—10:00 a.m. Wednesday June 14th, 2006 at Chosen Valley Veterinary Clinic (867-3610).

All dogs and cats that are at least six months old are required to be licensed. Licenses are due by July 1 of each year. Each license is \$10 per year for neutered or spayed animals and \$20 per year if not neutered or spayed. To purchase a license, be prepared to show proof of your pet's rabies vaccination when you stop by the City Clerk's office.

Lock It or Lose It!

An above average number of complaints have been received about abandoned bicycles. Do you know where your bicycle is?

When an abandoned bicycle is reported, it is picked up and placed in impound. Most of these bicycles are not being claimed.

As a bicycle owner, there are a couple things you can do to prevent your bicycle from being taken and to increase the chances of getting it back if it is taken.

- First, do not leave your bicycle unsecured when at home or away from home.
- Second, record your brand, model and serial number in a place you can find it if needed.
- Third, report it missing as soon as it disappears.
 You will need the brand, model and serial number so it can be entered into the system. Don't wait to see if it turns up.

Remember, it is easier to prevent a bicycle from being taken than it is to get it back once it is taken.

LOW HANGING BRANCHES, BUSHES, ETC.
