The Southern Minnesota Initiative Foundation has offered this money as part of their community development initiative. Two town meetings will be held this fall to identify projects that will enhance the community. All ideas and all residents are welcome! 
A local committee called the Chatfield Community Challenge is in place. The town meetings are designed to get participation from all members of the community, including new

and long-time residents, rural and in-town neighbors, singles, parents and empty nesters. The goal of the first meeting is to list the strengths of Chatfield and suggest projects that will benefit the community and its citizens. At the second meeting, projects will be chosen, goals set and action plans developed.

"Chatfield is a great place to live and work", says Shannon Glenzinski, Community Coordinator, "Our goal is to encourage all in the community to attend two town meetings this fall to help decide how to spend \$12,000 from the Southern MN Initiative Foundation in the best way possible to improve Chatfield. We need everyone's thoughts, talents and project ideas." Other towns in Minnesota and across the country are benefiting from this asset-based approach to developing communities because it focuses on the strengths rather than the problems.
