## CHARTER COMMISSION VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

One volunteer is needed to fill a vacancy on the City of Chatfield Charter Commission. This term will expire on January 31, 2022. An application can be obtained via email to jyoung@ci.chatfield.mn.us or by stopping at the Office of the City Clerk, 21 Second Street SE, Chatfield, MN.

The Charter Commission is made up of fifteen residents who are responsible for maintaining the City's Charter. The City Charter is, in effect, the City's constitution. The Commission meets intermittently, at least once each year. Appointments to the Commission are made by the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial District.

## DOG-WALKING ETIQUETTE



Following a few ground rules will help keep pets & people safe:

1. Use a Leash. While your dog may have excellent recall, there's no telling what might trigger them to bolt or involve them in a contentious situation with another dog or a person. Even though the city ordinance language includes at heel by command or leash, having your dog off leash is risky and may make others uncomfortable.
2. Be Respectful. This goes for people and property alike. Don't let your dog run up to or jump on other people; keep them close to you so others can pass you without the fear of falling. Also, keep them off neighborhood lawns. Landscaping is expensive and time-consuming, and dog pee is a lawn killer.
3. Pick Up Your Dog's Poop. It is unlawful to permit a dog (or cat) to defecate on any private property without consent or on any public property unless immediately removed and placed in a proper receptacle.
